Larger than the construction of the Alamodome, SBC (now AT&T) Center, and expansion of the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center, *combined*, University Health System's Target 2012: Capital Improvement Program is one of the largest construction projects in San Antonio history.

It will position the academic medical center and Level I trauma center at University Hospital, owned by the taxpayers of Bexar County, to meet the hospital needs of our growing region well into the future. It will also revitalize the west side of downtown, providing greater access to the latest outpatient diagnostic and treatment options in a convenient location.

Target 2012 projects total \$899.4 million and include:

- A state-of-the-art diagnostic and treatment facility at University Health Center – Downtown, the location of the historic Robert B. Green Hospital, which opened its doors nearly 100 years ago. The new center is expected to be open in 2012.
- A one-million-square-foot tower at University Hospital, to open in 2013, including:
 - o A new, larger emergency center
 - o More operating rooms
 - o Up to 713 single-patient rooms (to protect privacy & maximize infection control)
- Increased parking at both locations, including a 3,000-space garage at University Hospital
- Renovations to existing buildings at both locations.

This public forum will give you the opportunity to receive the latest information on University Health System's Capital Improvement Program. Officials will also be on hand to answer questions and talk about local business opportunities during the construction phase, as well as the economic and health benefits associated with this major expansion.
